Again we have had reports of near misses with people pulling out around near the Glennie St. side of the Church and not seeing young children walking along the marked path.

NAPLAN

From 14 May to 21 May, our Year 3 and 5 students will participate in NAPLAN Online. The information brochure for parents and carers addresses common questions about NAPLAN Online testing. (See link)

Tuesday 14 th May	Writing Online Year 5. Paper Test Year 3
Wednesday 15 th May	Reading
Thursday 16 th May	Language Conventions
Tuesday 21 st May	Numeracy

One of the main features of the NAPLAN Online format is that it is a tailored (or adaptive) test. The tailored test provides a more precise assessment of your child's performance in the areas of reading, language conventions (grammar, spelling and punctuation) and numeracy by adapting to responses. As your child progresses through the test, questions may be easier or more difficult, to better assess his or her ability. Your child should not be concerned if he or she finds the questions more difficult than expected – the pathway may be more challenging. Rest assured that the Year 3 and Year 5 teachers have prepared your children for the online format of the test. As a school we are hoping to access the results from the NAPLAN assessments earlier than in previous years due to this online format. Previously we have waited months for results which was, when received, out of date student data. With faster results it provides our teachers with explicit data for targeting the teaching and learning for our students. Again, as always, we ask parents to understand that this is just one type of assessment and should not be something that causes your child any anxiety. A Good Shepherd thought

"The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice"

(Jn 10:27).

Knowing God and one another has a lot to do with listening. Think of all the ways you "listen" to your children, spouse, loved ones listening with ears, with eyes, with touch, with action, and with the eyes and ears of the heart, listening "beyond words". "Listen" is an important word which we find in the Scriptures. How do I listen best? How do I like to be listened to?

Pray: With your child, light a candle together and listen to it burn. Or: listen to a flower growing. Yes, notice the silence! Pray for the grace to be a good listener.

Act: Today, work at using eye contact and body language as a way of listening better. Try it yourself, and then teach your child.

Remember: As I listen today, what am I hearing "beyond words"?


