Academic Program @ OLR

One of the constants at our staff meetings is for the staff to constantly reflect on the question: 'Who is my class?' By that it is imperative that each teacher knows the context and backgrounds of who they teach. One of the buzz terms we focus on is the Zone of Proximal Development. In other words what the teacher needs to do to take the next step in the learning for each child and build on what they know and what they still need to learn.

At OLR we have been very deliberate in what we teach and how we are teaching it. Using the mandated syllabus as our guide we want students to be able to engage with their learning through the development of thinking dispositions. Hence why we use thinking routines in our classrooms to delve into concepts and ideas across all subject areas. We have also introduced Literacy Pro from Year 3-Year 6 which enables the teacher to gauge each comprehension level (Lexile Level) for each students. Students are aware in an instant what their comprehension levels are and the sorts of books that are appropriate for their reading development.

In each class you will see a 'kidney shaped' table which allows the teacher to sit in a console to work on SGI (Small Group Instruction) which targets groups each day in the literacy block. We have a very deliberate literacy approach that begins with a shared text followed by task board activities that link to the understanding of the text. We teach phonics and we model the four forms of spelling.

We understand that in our school we have over 30 students with dyslexia or dyspraxia related issues that makes the printed word jump all over the page like waves at the beach. To address this all teachers are dyslexia trained and many have been trained in THRASS which is an explicit program that matches each letter to the phoneme (sound). Did you know there are 26 letters of the alphabet but 44 sounds or phonemes? It is very important for these students to rely on the sounding out and chunking of letters and words to be literate.

Gifted and Talented students now identified are being offered individual learning programs and some students are moving to other classes for English and Maths lessons. Soon Mrs Sheather will be embarking upon a major project for the identified students that match their ability levels.

Visit from St Cecilia' Staff

This Friday teachers from St Cecilia's Wyong will be here to observe the learning in action in our school. They will particularly look at how to teach thinking routines to the students and will engage with our students on their learning.

New Building and Other Facilities

The head of Finance and the facilities team will be here tomorrow to sign off on the new building. Basically, the rooms are ready to go with furniture in place and the latest in interactive technology ready to be used. Year 1-Year 4 will migrate into the new building sometime next week.

The demountables will be moved off site with one remaining to be utilised as a Parent resource and Parish Room. A new sport shed is being installed in the upcoming break out near the back-car park and a new drop off/ seating area with steps and railings will be finished ready for Term 3.

Music will return to one of the lower block classrooms and a new STEM room will be created so that students can do their robotics. technology and Science lessons in a dedicated space. The library will return to its normal use and the students will be able to play on an expansive grassed area.

Finally, quotes are being sought now for the installation of synthetic grass lined for netball and basketball on the basketball court. For those families who have been in our community for some time you should be very pleased that our school here at OLR Wyoming is now on par with the latest in facilities to provide the very best of education for your children. We should be very grateful for what we will be receiving.

Enrolment Update for 2020

Kindergarten for next year is very healthy. There are some vacancies in the current Year 1 and Year 3 but all other grades are operating at strong capacity. Any families still considering our school need to do so before the end of this term or they may miss out. Please spread the word.


MINI VINNIE NEWS
