Sunday Gospel Account

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." Luke 11: 1 – 13. This scripture passage is very famous because it is recorded that Jesus gave us the Our Father prayer when asked how to pray. Moreover, his message is very clear that through prayer and faith all things are possible. Unlike the lottery ticket where some of us may win big by the basic fact that if one purchases a ticket then there is every chance one can win something. Jesus basically states that faith regularly attended and through daily prayer enacted then all things are possible in the eyes of God. My challenge to all families is pray before your nightly dinner as an example to the children that prayer isn't always about asking for help, but it is also about giving thanks!

Dylan Williams Staff Development Day 21st August

I know parents will not be happy, but I am hoping for your trust in me for requiring a Staff development pupil free day on **Wednesday 21st August!** An opportunity has come up for the staff to attend a full day of professional learning on Formative Assessment Practices with Professor Dylan Williams from the United Kingdom. We will work with the staff from Mercy College Chatswood and OLGC Forestville who will also have a pupil free day. The big mover in the school space at present is the need to value add to each student's learning. Traditional end of term tests tell only part of the story and quite often learning at the point of need is lost if not addressed immediately by teachers. Formative assessment is about assessing students on the go, each day and then moving the student on to the next task on the learning progression continuum. Most teachers know how to do this but not always with great success. Professor Williams is the world-renowned expert in this space, and it is very important that OLR staff know how to implement his successful formative assessment strategies into the daily classroom here at OLR. Please be advised that this day is a pupil free day as the staff will be in Sydney attending this very important professional opportunity.

Community Consultation for a new School Principal

At the end of 2019 I will conclude 5 years at OLR and will move to another school setting for 2020. At present advertising for a new school Principal has begun. An important part of the selection process is community consultation for a new Principal. In the next few weeks an invitation will be sent out to all parents who would like to be involved in establishing the specific criteria you would like the new Principal to meet and the sort of Principal you feel is required for OLR.

Grandparent Liturgy and Morning Tea

Please remind all grandparents that a special liturgy for them will be held in the hall this Friday morning at 9am followed by open classrooms and morning tea. It is also a great opportunity for the community to walk through the new classrooms and see the learning in action. Grandparents are encouraged to read a page and listen to their grandchild read a page from the child's reader during the stay.

Spelling Bee and Public Speaking Competition

A feature of school life over the last few years has been the introduction of a whole school spelling bee and public speaking competition. Students will begin preparing for this soon with finals held later in the term. Please be aware of this and offer help when and where required.


Basketball Court Finally Finished and other Developments

It has taken a few years from when it was first built but this week the basketball court has been finally finished. My sincere thanks to the parent committees over the past few years in getting it completed. A new drop off bay has been developed in the back carpark and a new garden and turf area will soon be installed.
