## Sunday Gospel Account - Parable of The Lost Sheep

#### **NAPLAN 2019**

It is our understanding that individual student reports will be sent to parents early September. This morning all schools received their results and, again, our school has done well on all measures for Year 3 and Year 5. We are on average or way above the average for expected means in all areas of Literacy and Numeracy. You may recall when the students undertook the tests in May and for the first time these were completed online. Unfortunately, including our school, when it came to the writing test computers crashed everywhere so all schools do not have the results for writing at this stage. We are not certain when or if we will get results for writing. We have results for grammar, punctuation, reading, spelling and numeracy. Parents of students in Year 3 and 5 communication about this, we are told, will not be sent to you from the government until early September.

#### Parent Council Meeting Discussion and Attention for All Parents

As we are a Catholic School with well over 86% of students and families in our school who are baptised, Catholic there is an expectation that we try harder to attend Parish/School Masses which are held twice a term on Sundays. This weekend all the Gold classes are invited to be a part of the Parish school Mass at 9:30am. As with many events that take place in the school particularly when it comes to volunteering for something it is the same families who rise to the challenge each time. And yet everyone gets to enjoy the benefit of the fruits of the labours of so few with last Sunday's Bunning's BBQ an example. Obviously when it comes to church attendance, I have no authority to insist that people get to church as it is a personal experience. However, to make a sacrifice for one Mass a term surely is not too much to ask? I really do expect families to make the effort!

#### Discord and other Social Media Sites Children are Using

Can I please ask that every parent of every child (even the good kids) peer into the social media accounts that each is using? Quite often the issue of bullying these days refer to what is written in chat rooms of social media applications by children you think should know how to behave, but in a virtual world behave poorly. Parents at wit's end trying to console their child who is highly anxious or withdrawn because of what has been written about them by other children in group chat rooms turn to the school for help. As a school we must deal with issues that don't happen at school but generally involve children from it. This week I was alerted to some dialogue between children from our school and what has been written by them or in their name by someone else about another child. The content of which was quite disturbing to say the least.

#### **Questions for Parents**

Are you aware of what your child is doing with their smart phones/tablets/computers? Do you supervise your child's social media accounts? Are you linked in with your child's social media accounts so that you are aware of what he/she is posting but also aware of what the dialogue is? How many hours after school is your child on his/her device? When the lights go out for sleeping is your child still on their devices? Can I please insist that every parent today does an audit based on the aforementioned questions so that you are fully aware of what really is going on with the use of devices, particularly for the purposes of social media activities?
