#### Sunday Gospel Account

"For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." Luke 13: 22 – 30. Spiritual conditioning requires the same discipline as physical conditioning. Reward usually follows effort. The same amount of time and energy that goes into physical exercise should be the same that goes into a faith life. Jesus knows we are all sinners but our efforts to make amends is what will be rewarded.

#### Academic Results and Providing Support for Students with Specific Needs

Late last week all schools received the online NAPLAN results for 2019 minus the writing component. On every measure our school did really well in both Year 3 and Year 5. For the past 5 years OLR has consistently performed above state and national means and in some cases way above the expectations. We believe that through the introduction of Cultures of Thinking, the employment of literacy and maths coaches and through data driven program design, we have been able to deliver strong academic results.

Students who have been diagnosed with a specific learning need receive funding proportional to the data matched to the government formula for learning support. What we are able to offer at OLR is the same as other schools whether public, private or Catholic. All OLR staff are trained in dyslexia, gifted and talented and disability standards including such things as asthma, anaphylaxis and autism spectrum disorder. The academic results for such students as measured through assessments such as NAPLAN is an area of celebration for our school. The learning gains in some cases have been beyond expectations where some students have recorded gains of up to two band levels.

#### **Parliamentary Visit**

Our school has been selected to host a visit from NSW Parliamentarians who are looking into outcome-based funding in NSW schools. Schools selected for this visit need to provide evidence of the impact of data to improve educational outcomes for all students. This is something to be celebrated as the focus will be on value added education for students with specific needs and from specific demographics. We welcome the visit as an opportunity to celebrate the strong educational work taking place at OLR. The exact date has not been established so more information will follow.

#### Financial Literacy – Start Smart

One of the criticisms of modern schooling is that we do not have a specific curriculum for financial literacy for such things as saving money, mortgages, etc. Whether that is the domain of schools is up for debate. At OLR to celebrate Literacy and Numeracy Week, commencing the 10<sup>th</sup> September, every class will receive direct instruction in financial literacy. Obviously, the lessons will be tailored for the different classes, but these will be run by educators from the Commonwealth Bank. Even though the bank is sponsoring the lessons they are not allowed to push on to the children any products and services. The content of the lessons is around knowing the difference between needs and wants in the lower grades to learning about simple and compound interest in the upper levels.

#### Physical Improvements around the School

A new driveway gate has been installed and some internal fencing removed to make way for a new outdoor play deck for Kindergarten. The existing demountables will be removed from the school this week, with one staying to be used as a family/Parish/play group space. It will be modified to allow easy access for elderly parishioners as well as easy access to a new playground area and deck being constructed at the back of the current Kindergarten rooms. New turf will be laid near the newly constructed stairs in the back-car park and the children will soon get to play with outdoor chess and snake n ladders games.

#### Parent Council Volunteers and Fundraising

There is a belief among some that payment of school fees means that there is no need to fundraise or for that matter volunteer for any fundraising efforts carried out by the Parent Council. Catholic schools receive 84 cents out of every dollar a public school receives from the government. The main reason we charge fees is to make up the difference between what a public school receives, and we don't. Therefore, luxury extras such as a brand-new basketball court and new playground facilities sometimes needs to be funded by fundraising efforts. Private schools on the coast who charge school fees three times and sometimes four times what we charge here at OLR can build luxurious concert halls, tennis courts and soccer fields. We rely on fundraising in order to build the extras otherwise we would have to charge parents a lot more than what we do. Our Parent Council works tirelessly for the whole community. Thank you to all those who contribute to the fundraising or volunteer your support is greatly appreciated.


