#### Sunday Gospel Account

"If the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Luke 12:32-48. The Gospel readings of the past few weeks have been about focusing your attention on God. It is so hard to do when our world largely is motivated by what the dollar can buy and how wealth tends to have a great link to the sorts of doors that can open for you. I guess the only real truism in life is that one day it gets taken away in our passing. Our faith teaches us that heaven awaits good and faithful servants who have lived a life of service and helping others and in gratitude. Only God knows who makes it and who doesn't. This Sunday's Gospel account is a reminder that the temples, kingdoms and empires one builds in this life all comes to nought in the next! Live a life of selflessness all the selfish lives are surely taken.

#### The School that Fails and the Grass that is Greener

What started as a novel idea in one British school is starting to take root in many others. Greasley Beauvale School Nottingham England assigns grades to the parents on their parenting and the impact on improved student performance is astonishing. Based on the well known and widely researched fact is that family environment is the single most important determinant of how a child fares in class. The parents are graded on how well they support their child at school and the sorts of role models they are. Parents who receive A's and B's largely had students who also received A's and B's. Those receiving D's and E's manifested itself in the students also getting such academic grades.

The sorts of categories or items that were graded included but was not limited to the following:

- Helicopter parents who listened and followed every word of their child whether true or not.
- Attitude of parents to school and the teacher. Did they speak terrible about the school and teacher in front of the child and therefore signalling to the child that their unacceptable petulant behaviour or poor attention to task or needs not being met was really the school and teacher fault not their own.
- Junk food in the lunch box and general poor nutrition
- Helping with homework
- Enforcement of screen time or not.

Can you imagine if our school or any school did this in Australia? What do you think the reaction would be of parents? What impact would setting grades on parents have on student performance? Schools and teachers get judged and graded daily even though we are secondary on the list of greatest influence on children.

This morning I had a visit from Catherine Carey from Mary Macs kitchen at St John's Woy Woy. The heartbreaking stories of homelessness she relayed to me was a very real reminder of what we should be doing as Christians to help those in need. Mary Macs operates out of the Parish hall where all utility costs such as water and electricity are covered by the church. They serve 24 000 meals a year and it costs approximately \$150 000 to run. All people who help are volunteers. They desperately need financial support as they get nothing from any government agencies. On average 120 – 150 homeless people every day for 5 days a week arrive at the hall for a meal. \$6 a plate is all they are after. Please go to the site and help!

## St Mary of the Cross

Tomorrow we will celebrate the feast day of Saint Mary of the Cross with Father Raphael.

Mary Mackillop was born in Melbourne in 1842 and died in Sydney on 8 August 1909. She took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor offering special care to destitute women and children. She is remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of hardship, and for her abiding trust in God. By remembering St Mary of the Cross we also keep in mind her many messages that have been passed down to us today. She especially wanted us to love God and not to worry too much about unimportant things because our loving God will always make sure that we have the things we need. Mary truly believed this.



## **The Sacrament of Confirmation**

Last Saturday, Father Raphael confirmed 43 children. In the second reading we heard St Paul unpack the gifts of Holy Spirit to the Corinthians. He says that the particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. He also likened the supporting of our children during their faith journey, this is similar to the way in which we support our children to brush their teeth. We model it, we do it for them and then we encourage them to do it for themselves. The children who received the gifts of the Holy Spirit on Saturday received it with grace, reverence and celebration.
